
its **Digital Africa** subsidiary, and its **Propulse** technical assistance offering designed to scale up the impacts and performance of its partners.

BREAKDOWN BY SECTOR




BREAKDOWN BY FINANCIAL PRODUCT



Nigeria

Helping to finance high-impact SMEs

First City Monument Bank (FCMB) is Nigeria's third-biggest lender in the SME sector. With a solid digital offering, the bank is ideally placed to offer financing solutions tailored to these businesses. **Proparco** enables FCMB to strengthen its strategic position in two priority segments: high-impact SMEs and support for businesses owned and run by women. It helps support the financing of nearly 1,600 SMEs and the expansion of over 300 SMEs managed or owned by women. Part of these funds is earmarked for projects with climate co-benefits

HEALTH, EDUCATION, AGRICULTURE

Central Africa / Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC)

An impact fund to support micro-businesses and SMEs

The African Rivers Fund (ARF) finances micro-businesses and SMEs, mostly in Democratic Republic of Congo. **ARF** is very active in local economic development and it enables entrepreneurs – often from disadvantaged backgrounds – to access capital in the key sectors of healthcare, education and agriculture. It is aiming to expand into Uganda, Congo and Burundi. **ARF**'s support has helped to create around 1,500 jobs.

SERVICES, SUPPORT TO SMEs

South Africa

Improving shared taxi services

70 % of business and school trips in South Africa are taken in 16-seater minibus taxi-cabs. **SA Taxi** pprovides financing to SMEs that own a fleet of shared taxis. Proparco's loan in local currency will help companies to grow and put new, safer vehicles on the roads for the millions of passengers who use these minibuses every day. Nearly 360 SMEs will be supported, generating 650 direct jobs. This operation is fully in phase with the **Choose Africa** initiative.

Egypt

Solar Feed in Tariff - Benban solar power plant

This project finances the construction and operation of 5 solar power facilities at the Benban complex in the Aswan Governorate and is part of the **"Solar Feed in Tariff"** program (total capacity 125 MW). Ultimately, it aims to improve the power grid and cut carbon emissions by 148.8 ktCO_2 a year. It will help create 7,100 jobs.

Uganda

Generating electricity from sugar cane residue

The loan granted to **Scoul** – Uganda's 3rd biggest sugar producer – is financing the construction of a 26 MW cogeneration facility powered by bagasse (i.e., sugar cane residue). The electricity produced will be used in **Scoul**'s production process, and part will be sold back to the national grid. In a country where rates of electrification are low and electricity consumption among the lowest on the continent, around 110 GWh of renewable energy should be injected back into the national grid, providing 1.5 million Ugandans with access to electricity.

Partnering young businesses

MSurvey is a start-up that specialises in real-time monitoring of consumer opinions. It enables African businesses, universities, hospitals and media to question African citizens and consumers directly via their cellphone in relation to their habits and needs.

Proparco's investment, alongside the **TIDE Africa** fund, is helping to transform MSurvey into a pan-African player. Proparco is therefore partnering the development of an innovative start-up that offers a previously non-existent digital solution, tailored to an African context.

Zambia

Boosting financial inclusion in rural parts of Zambia

AB Bank Zambia is the only bank financing SMEs and micro-businesses in Zambia. In 2019, thanks to **Choose Africa** via the FISEA* facility managed by **Proparco**, €1.8 million was invested in the bank's equity and €180,000 was used to finance the introduction of digital loan and savings services for rural populations. Using the **eTumba** mobile digital platform, the aim is to boost financial inclusion – especially amongst women – in rural communities far from physical bank branches and to create intuitive products that meet the needs of the targeted populations.


